NCUA Issues Prohibition Order

ALEXANDRIA, Va. (June 17, 2011) – The National Credit Union Administration has issued an order prohibiting the following individual from participating in the affairs of any federally insured financial institution:

- **Aimee Rattiff**, a former employee of **Fort Campbell Federal Credit Union, Clarksville, Tenn.**, was convicted of theft of property. Rattiff was sentenced to probation, ordered to perform 150 hours of public service work and pay restitution in the amount of \$4200.

Violation of a prohibition order is a felony offense punishable by imprisonment and a fine of up to \$1 million.
